



## Now what? AJP's goals and vision



### CONSULTATION WITHIN APA (2022-2023)



- > Met regularly with APA Equity, Diversity & Inclusion (EDI/DEI) Office
- > Met regularly with APA Human Rights Team
- Consulted on revision of Inclusive Language Handbook to include antisemitic tropes & aspects of Jewish culture
- Created a video as part of the Presidential Cultural Series about Judaism and how it impacts being a psychologist
- > Began a new psychology & antisemitism research grant with APF
- > Organized presentations on antisemitism for APA Convention
- > Authored an article on APA & Antisemitism for the American Psychologist
- > Applied for official affiliation with APA with NBI at February Council Meeting

#### EDUCATION JEWISH CULTURE

#### SPECIAL PROJECTS: TRAINING FOR PSYCHOTHERAPISTS

- The October 7<sup>th</sup> massacre in Israel by Hamas has raised the level of fear and lack of safety for many Jews
- ➢ Most psychotherapists do not have the skills or information to be culturally competent to treat Jewish clients, especially those with increased anxiety & depression over the war.
- ➢ We are beginning a training project with AJP trauma experts to provide an all day workshop at APA 2024 in Seattle in August.
- > We hope to adapt that program for a series of webinars in Fall 2024
- >AEN has given us a small grant to begin this education
- > We are developing a directory of AJP member psychotherapists for other Jewish agencies
